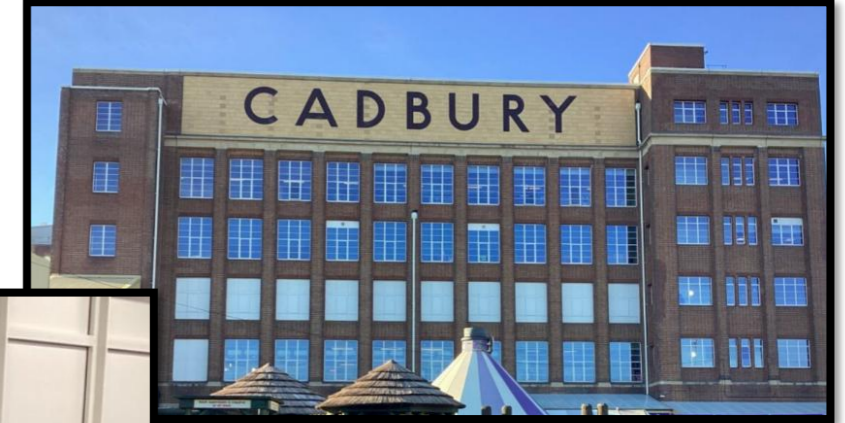


Chocolate-Filled Learning at Cadbury World

WHO

Year 5 and 6 Pupils.



WHAT

Year 5 and 6 visited **Cadbury World** on **21st November**. Pupils explored the chocolate-making process from cocoa bean to chocolate bar, enjoyed interactive exhibits, and watched demonstrations. They even had the chance to taste melted chocolate and see how modern machines help create the treats we know today.



WHY

The trip supported their learning about the Victorian era. Children discovered how John Cadbury started his chocolate business in Birmingham and what factory life was like at that time. Seeing the history and processes in action helped pupils connect classroom learning to the real world, making it a fun and memorable educational experience.
