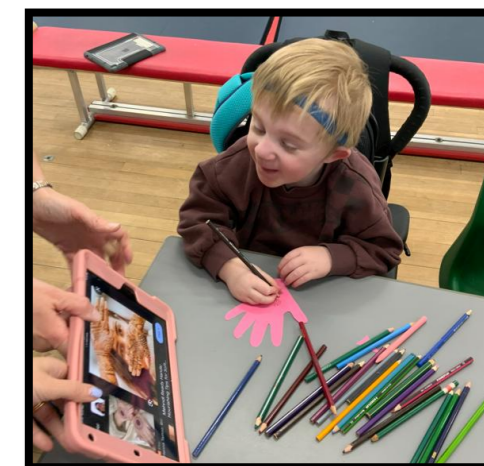
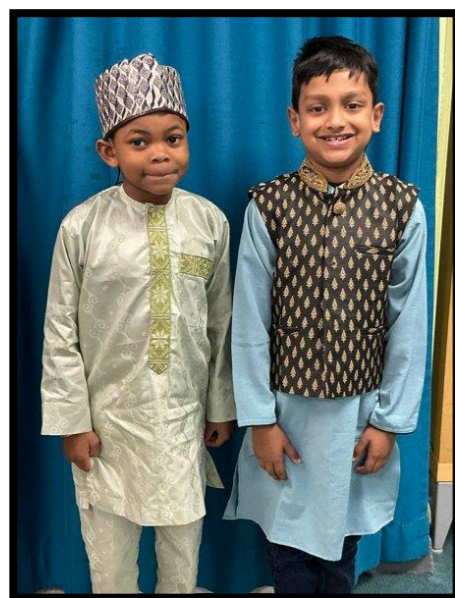


Eid Celebration

WHO

All pupils from Foundation to Year 6 were involved in this celebration.



WHY

This celebration helped children learn more about Eid and develop their understanding of different cultures and religions. It supported respect, inclusion, and appreciation of diversity within our school community.

The hands-on activities encouraged creativity and engagement, while the assembly deepened pupils' knowledge of Islamic traditions and the importance of Eid.

WHAT

As part of our enrichment morning, the school celebrated Eid Mubarak through a range of creative and cultural activities. Children took part in making Eid decorations, designing and creating lanterns, and producing Eid cards to share messages of celebration. They also practised henna-style art using paint on paper hand templates.

The morning also included watching an assembly that explained why Muslims celebrate Eid and how it marks the end of Ramadan and a time of joy, gratitude, and giving. Both children and adults joined in by wearing their Eid celebration outfits to help mark the occasion.
