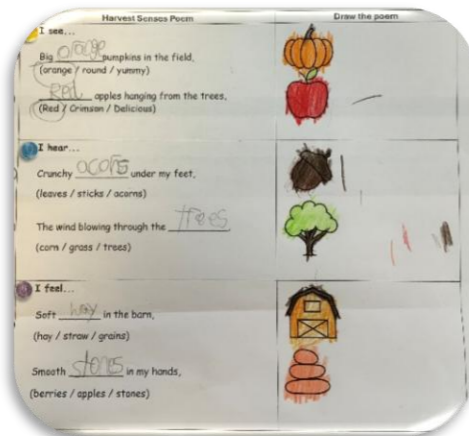
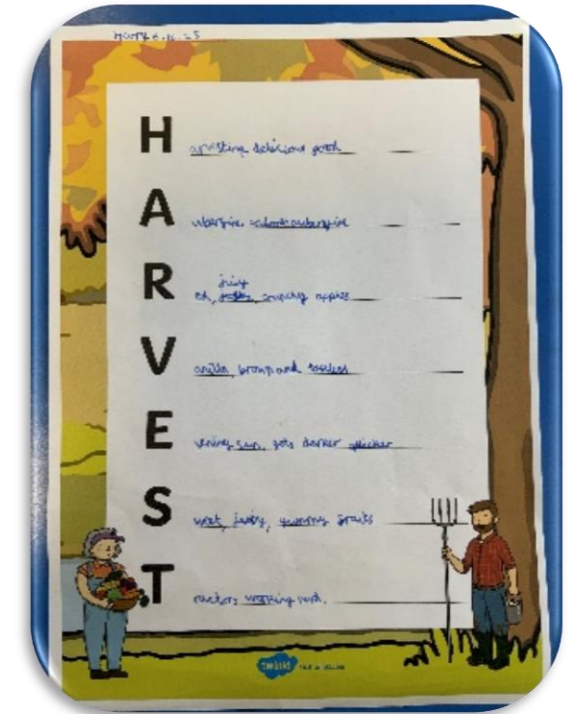


HARVEST 2025
