## WHAT

Severn Trent Water Team visited the school on 17th and 19th March to deliver learning experiences about water safety, conservation, and how water is used and treated.

On Tuesday 17th March, Andy led a whole-school assembly focused on the importance of saving water and using it responsibly. Pupils learned how to reduce water waste at home and school, and what should not be flushed down the toilet, which can cause serious blockages in the sewer system.

On Thursday 19th March, Andy and the team delivered the “Wonderful Water Tour.” This interactive session showed pupils how water is cleaned, treated, and returned safely to the environment.
